

Confirmation Day!



Expanded Worship Opportunities


In May, we'll be offering additional opportunities to gather together for worship. Each Sunday, we'll continue to livestream our worship at 11:00 a.m. on Facebook Live and YouTube, with the worship available to view on those platforms afterwards as well.

The following options will be available while Lucas County is in the "red" category. When our county becomes "orange", adaptations may be made.

Each Sunday there will be an opportunity to gather together, either in our parking lot or in our sanctuary.

Our Parking Lot services will be held on May 9 and May 23 at 11:00 a.m. We're making 2 small adjustments to the parking lot services from last fall. If you need to use the restroom, the Fellowship hall door (north end of the building) will be unlocked and you're invited to enter and make your way to the bathrooms. (This way trips to the bathroom will not be "on camera" for all to see!). In case of bad weather, the parking lot service will be suspended and worship will be held online only. We only had to do this one Sunday last year, and we're hoping for equally good weather this year!

Our sanctuary worship services will be held on May 2, May 16, and May 30 at 11:00 a.m. Covid protocols will be in place including having a temperature check as you enter the building, safe distances between groups, wearing masks, and refraining from singing. When you arrive for worship, you will be escorted to a seat/s. Everyone will remain seated during worship. At the close of the service, you will be dismissed through the fire exit door into the fellowship hall and out to the parking lot. You're welcome to pause in the parking lot to visit with others. Since we have sanctuary spaces for 14 families, you're asked to use "Sign-up Genius" to reserve a place for each separate worship service. If you're not comfortable using the computer, you're invited to call St. Stephen by noon on Saturday to reserve a spot.


