2025 The Year of Listening

"Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live..." Isaiah 55:3

Several months ago, our synod began to think about 2025 and a yearly theme. The synod staff decided to focus on the "year of listening".

Listening is a skill we're called to use with intentionality. I once told someone close to me—"You're hearing me, but you're not listening to me". This person was clearly hearing my voice but was failing to listen to me as I expressed what I needed and what was important to me at that point in my life.

Focusing in on what someone is saying with their words and what is behind those words and those word choices is fascinating. Deep listening helps us to be present with people—hearing their story and responding with care, concern and occasionally a word of challenge.

As we move through the world, how do we refine our ability to listen—to listen to God, to listen to ourselves, to listen to each other, to listen to our community?

In a world where we often hear each other, but don't fully listen to each other, would you be interested in working on this skill?

Our synod website has some resources, including a monthly listening guide that centers in on a song, with weekly suggestions to engage the music; a reading plan to hear the whole New Testament in 5 minutes a day, 5 days a week. You'll find those here at https://nwos-elca.church/listening/ Our St. Stephen book group is also reading and discussing "I never thought of it that way", by Monica Guzman, as our February book. Our church council is planning to focus our monthly devotions on this theme.

So, as you hear the sounds of the world around you, from the neighborhood dog barking, to the sound of the furnace kicking on, to the voice of your loved ones speaking, to the voice of God—what do you hear? How are you listening?






JOY Lunch


GODSPELL




