In our Wednesday Bible study this week, we got "off the topic". While looking at 1 Corinthians 3:2, where Paul writes, "I fed you (members of the church in Corinth) with milk, not solid food, for you were not ready for solid food", we began talking about how participants have grown in their journey as a Christian.

One of the growth areas was in their understanding of prayer.

Paul's critique of the church in Corinth also applies to us, today. When we first learn to pray, we often approach God as if (in the words of the cartoon Calvin and Hobbes), God is a cosmic Santa Claus—and if we ask hard enough, God will jump through hoops and do what we ask God to do.

Praying for something over and over again (and not getting the result we think we want) can become discouraging. We begin to wonder if God is listening, if God is truly there. Why are we not getting the results we're praying for?

But hopefully, as we mature in faith, we realize that God doesn't always just do whatever we ask, whenever we ask it. (If so, that would mean that we control God). God sometimes says, 'Yes", "No", "not now", or "not as you're imagining it" to our prayers.

Since so much of our life is reciprocal (like you will get an A if you demonstrate you know xyz – or you got me a Christmas gift so I need to get you one), we sometimes think this is the way God works as well. We think that if I am a good follower of Christ, then God should do (fill in the blank) for me.

But God doesn't choose to work this way. God's ways are not our human ways.

Instead, God acts as God wishes. And sometimes, its only years and years later that we realize God did answer our prayer—just in an unexpected way—and in some ways that this was even better than anything we could have imagined. And in response to this unending, inexplicable grace of God, we stand in awe and gratitude.

So in this season of thanksgiving, what are some of the prayers you had made that God has granted, just as you asked? And what prayers has God answered in a different way that you ever dreamed? What prayers are you continuing to pray, waiting to hear from God?
