
Mary Ann Klimesh (January 28, 1943-December 16, 2020)

Mary Ann Klimesh of Sylvania, Ohio, died peacefully at home from ALS (amyotrophic lateral sclerosis; also known as Lou Gehrig's disease) on December 16, 2020. She was 77.

Born in New Castle, Indiana, on January 28, 1943, Mary Ann was the daughter of Reverend William and Kathryn (Hessong) Butt. Mary Ann married Don Klimesh on August 20, 1966.

Mary Ann's greatest joy was her family. Another of Mary Ann's passions was quilting. Besides making dozens of quilts for family and friends, she also greatly enjoyed and actively participated in the Lutheran World Relief quilting group at St. Stephen Lutheran Church from 2014 until February 2020. Throughout her life, Mary Ann was a tireless volunteer, proffering her time for a variety of causes.

In addition to her husband of 54 years, Mary Ann leaves behind her children, Douglas Klimesh of Ann Arbor, Matthew Klimesh of Pasadena, CA, Lia Klimesh of Sylvania, and Jessica Klimesh of Sylvania.



Bob Rieck (July 17, 1941-December 17, 2020)

Robert E. Rieck, died on December 17th, 2020, of complications after contracting COVID-19. He was 79.

Bob was born July 17, 1941, to Robert and Edith Rieck. He graduated from Libbey and entered the U.S. Army in 1960.

He was a member of the American Turners, the Toledo Schwäbischer Unterstützungs Verein, and the Teutonia Choir of Toledo. For many years, Bob was the Food Chairman for the German American Festival. Bob was also a skilled bowler, often giving professional bowlers a run for their money in the Annual PBA Pro-Am Tournament. He was table tennis champ of his Army base and once played the world champion.

But most important to Bob was his family. He met his wife Nancy at a Tiedtke's party in the basement of a bowling alley. They were married on October 2, 1965. They raised their two sons in West Toledo. Later in his life, Bob loved spending time with his grand-daughters, Danielle and Madison.

Surviving Bob are his beloved wife of 55 years, Nancy; sons, Brian (Kristina) and Kevin (Christine); and granddaughters, Danielle and Madison. He was preceded in death by his sister, Beverly.


